I respectfully submit the following report of the part taken by this Battalion in the action at
Harrisburg, Tenn. June 26 1863. The Battalion then being attached to the 2nd Brigade 1st Div. M.C. formed line in front of the enemy's position
early on the morning of June 26th. As ordered on the evening of June 25th. The Battalion formed in column with a strong line of skirmishers
thence the post advanced across an open field under a heavy fire of artillery and musketry to attack the enemy strongly posted on the hills beyond.
When half way across the post Capt. John A. Thompson commanding Battalion fell from his horse mortally wounded - I as one of the
command. Upon reaching the base of the hills the enemy hastily retreated. In pursuit we crossed the Battalion bivouacked on the field.
The conduct of officers and men was all that could be desired. I enclose a list of casualties. (I am quarterly return for June 1863.)

I have the honor to submit the following report of the part taken by the Batt. under
my command in the engagements with the enemy on the 27th and 28th inst. on Chickamauga Creek Georgia a few miles south of this place).
On the morning of the 27th after smoking all the night before the Battalion took position on the right of Battery H. S. U.S. Artillery
at 10 o'clock a.m. by the order of the Brigade Commander I marched to the front and joined the 1st Batt. 15th U.S. Inf. then already engaged.
Scarcely a few days the command was attacked in flank by an overwhelming force of the enemy and compelled to retire to the crest of an
adjacent hill from which position the enemy was repulsed. The Battalion bivouacked with the Brigade one mile from the field. Early on
the morning of the 28th a line was formed on the east of the Chattanooga road. At 9 o'clock a.m. a severe attack was made upon this position.
My command was ordered to support the 1st Batt. 15th U.S. Inf. and at once became warmly engaged. The troops on my left soon gave way and
my position being flanked the command being exposed to an oblique fire I moved to back to the timber in the rear and then returned
engaged until the enemy was repulsed. In pursuance of an order from Capt. G. W. Smith commanding the 1st Batt. 15th U.S. Inf. I retired
in driving the enemy from the open field on the left. The command being now much reduced in numbers I took position in the breast works
near our formation in the evening. About 5 o'clock p.m. a severe attack was again made upon this part of the line. I remained until ordered
to fall back, suffering considerable loss in the movement. After the close of the General commanding the Brigade ordered to Report and
remained in position near this place until the morning of the 29th inst. when the command marched to this place.

The following is a detailed statement of the loss sustained by the Batt. ^{killed} commissioned officers 1. selected men 13. Wounded 2. General's of
64. col. men Wounded and missing 18. col. men Missing 3. General's of 1. and 4. col. men Total 18. Wounded 10. col. men
all the officers present with the Battalion acted well and performed their duty but I am especially indebted to Capt. Lewis, Lieut. Hutchinson
and other for assistance during the Battle. Lieut. Lucius S. Brown after acting with the greatest gallantry was severely wounded

1st Div during the Atlanta Campaign from May 27 1864 to Sept 1 1864. At the commencement of the campaign the Detachment consisted of two Companies each composed of eight Companies viz Companies B. L. & S. 1st Batt. 4th & H. 3rd Batt. 1st Div. (Company attached to 1st Batt.) were commanded by Capt George W. Smith; Co. A. B. C. & D. 1st Batt. commanded by Capt William Estess; Capt Smith in connection with his command of the 1st Batt. was also Detachment Comdr. until relieved by Capt James M. Kellogg June 15th. From July 11th to July 25th the Detachment was commanded by Capt Kellogg with Capt Smith as acting field officer & second in command. From July 25th to Sept 1st with Capt Robert B. Hall as acting field officer & second in command. Capt Kellogg was wounded in action Sept 1st & the command of the Detachment was assumed by me on the same day in the Battle Field. The Reports of Captains Smith & Estess above referred to, are complete & sufficiently particular to furnish the history of the Detachment & its operations down to July 11th.

In continuation of said Reports, I have further to Report that from July 11th to July 15th the Detachment was held in reserve the whole army manning operations to find the enemy South of the Chattahoochee River. July 17th crossed the Chattahoochee River at Battle Ferry. July 18th crossed Mays Creek in pursuit of enemy; July 20th crossed Black Tree Creek & took position in line of battle, but was ordered during the day (the night having been attacked) to the support of the 1st Div. 1st C. O. July 21st marched to the left of our line & connected with the 4th Corps; July 22nd against the Div. & marched to within two miles of Atlanta & a front West of Union the Western Atlantic R. R. took position for attack. I remained until July 25th during which period a continued skirmish was kept up. Several times the Detachment was subjected to heavy artillery fire of the enemy. July 25th marched to the extreme right of the army, participating in a successful attack on our lines, & covering the night flank. July 26th the Detachment as skirmishers drove the enemy's cavalry & infantry back until dark, July 27th in connection with 1st Div. 1st C. O. made frontal reconnoissance, & same night marched back to the left, & took position in the entrenched lines of our army. On the night of the 15th Corps, July 27th at Oak Grove the Detachment was detached & thrown out in front of our works, with three Companies deployed as skirmishers, ordered to advance, determined never being ordered by the enemy, from his rifle pits, to the advance of our skirmish line, & no connection being had on our right the 15th C. O. safety was ordered to the right, & the two Regiments then advanced moving on capturing all in front of them, capturing two lines of well constructed rifle pits & all in them; sweeping up to the abutment of the camp works, in the face of a direct musketry & artillery fire, determined upon us from behind his main works, the two Regiments held their position until darkness enabled them to throw up entrenchments within one hundred & fifty yards of the enemy line. This day well long the remainder in the Regiment for the determined & desperate nature of the conflict, & the great loss incurred. In this charge that gallant young Soldier 1st Lieut Edward Townsend lost a leg, Lieut Townsend displayed in this field, the same extraordinary bravery in the face of death & patient heroism in suffering that won for him his Commission in the Army, on the Potomac. The Detachment lost one killed & wounded, twenty five per centum of its effective force. Those that were absent, old & band soldiers,

were wounded by Charles H. Peterson Co. 5th Batt. Benjamin R. Elliott Co. 5th Batt. & Charles H. Black Co. 3rd Batt. The Detachment in this affair captured prisoners greater in number than its own strength, taking several important notes with their officers, while in the act of re-organizing their lines. From July 25th to Aug 25th the Detachment occupied the line captured on the 20th, and the old front line of our works, during that time (on the 19th & 20th) we marched twice to the right of our army & back, at support to the 2nd C. O. in movements made by said Corps. Aug 26th at night, withdrew from our line (in connection with the Army of the Cumberland) thus commencing that brilliant flank movement, which ended in the decisive victory of Donelson, & resulted in the capture of Columbus. Aug 28th reached the Westport R. R. & Aug 29th aided in its destruction, Aug 30th & 31st marched & counter-marched with a view to reach the Atlanta & Macon R. R. On Sept 1st was fought the Battle of Donelson, the decisive & final struggle of the campaign, in which this Detachment participated, with a loss, almost as great as that sustained on the 17th. A special Report of the part taken by this Detachment in the Battle of Donelson has been forwarded by me; a copy of which Report is attached & made part of this Report. Sept 2nd to 7th the Army leisurely fell back to Atlanta & encamped, this Detachment encamping on the Westport R. R. 2 1/2 miles South West from Atlanta, on the extreme right of the 1st C. O. All the movements & operations of this Detachment during the campaign, were made in connection with the 1st Div. 1st C. O. I give below the name of every officer of the Regiment who has participated in the campaign, or any portion of it, with his rank, command, date of joining, &c.

- Capt James M. Kellogg joined & assumed command of Detachment & wounded Sept 1st
- Capt George W. Smith participated in the whole campaign; commanded Detachment till June 15th & 1st Batt. till July 25th when appointed on Staff 1st Div.
- Capt Robert B. Hall participated in the whole campaign; commanded Co. B. & D. 1st Batt. He commanded 1st Batt. from July 25th & Detachment from Sept 1st. Slightly wounded May 11th
- Capt William Estess participated in the whole campaign; commanded Co. C. 2nd Batt. & the 2nd Batt. until July 11th appointed on Staff July 15th
- Capt Phillip R. Torrey in service, under charges, when campaign opened & resigned June 28th (weight accepted)
- Capt Israel B. Denton commanded Co. C. 2nd Batt. till Aug 25th resigned & leave of absence granted Aug 23rd
- Capt Richard L. Corcoran commanded Co. A. 2nd Batt. left sick at Kennesaw Ga June 30th
- Capt Thomas H. Burt participated in the whole campaign; commanded Co. H. 1st Batt. till Aug 25th when appointed on Staff slightly wounded July 30th
- Capt Andrew S. Burt commanded Co. D. 1st Batt. & Co. 3rd Batt. participated in the whole campaign; & captured battle of Donelson Sept 1st
- Capt Morgan & Ogden Oneick report when campaign opened left sick at Lees on May 27th
- First Lieut Thomas B. Burrows detailed command at Dallas June 25th Comdr. Co. E. 2nd Batt. severely wounded Sept 1st
- First Lieut James Powell commanded Co. B. 1st Batt. & H. 3rd Batt. participated in the whole campaign severely wounded Sept 1st
- First Lieut Horace Brown in service at opening of Campaign. Resigned July 25th
- First Lieut Daniel H. Benham 1st Lieut 1st Batt. Comdr. Co. E. 1st Batt. from July 5th to July 15th was Adj. of Detachment from June 6th to July 1st appointed on Staff July 15th participated in the whole campaign.
- First Lieut Frederick C. Fletcher 1st Lieut 2nd Batt. entered campaign received leave of absence Aug 15th
- First Lieut Frederick H. Brown 1st Lieut 1st Batt. participated in the whole campaign as Adj. 2nd Batt. & Co. C. 2nd Batt. till July 9th appointed Detachment. Left June 27th
- First Lieut William H. Buelow detailed May 16th commanded Co. A. & B. 2nd Batt. till Aug 26th when appointed Adj. to 1st Batt. & Detachment slightly wounded July 30th
- First Lieut John J. Adams detailed May 16th Comdr. Co. G. 2nd Batt. till severely wounded May 21st
- First Lieut Edward Townsend entered campaign & wounded Co. B. 1st & 2nd Batt. till severely wounded Aug 27th

three days on the 15th withdrew from Bayonet Point & marching to the night passed through Camp Cress
 Camp & encamped. On the 15th marched about a mile. formed line of battle & commenced advancing
 against the enemy who fell back skirmishing. On the 16th continued the advance with a strong skir-
 mish line under command of Lieut David & drove the enemy to his works near Resaca. after heavy
 skirmishing. 15th under a heavy fire all day from the enemy works. On the 16th the enemy having
 retreated, marched to Resaca. Here Lieut William B. Wallace joined. On the 17th crossed the "Crossing" Run
 & on the 18th arrived at East Station where the command rested till the 23rd, when resuming the march
 through woods under a heavy fire of artillery. & fortified. Here the command lay for some 91 days est-
 ablished to a most harassing fire from the enemy sharpshooters, which killed & wounded many valiant
 lie men among the dead was Sergeant Major Bliss a gallant & faithful soldier. On the night of
 the 28th the Battalion was ordered to advance to a commanding position then occupied by the enemy from
 the front of the right of the Brigade & to throw up a work in the form of a crescent, refusing both
 its flanks so as to be as near the main line as possible. The enemy parties having first been driven
 in by the skirmishers of the 16th Infantry, the Battalion advanced & carried out the order, working all
 night under an artillery fire. By morning had completed the work sufficiently under it tenable. The
 next day the work was thoroughly finished. On the 30th the enemy made a determined attack, in force, on the
 work, but were repulsed with heavy loss. The Battalion sustaining a loss of Lieut Allen wounded
 thirty three (33) killed men. The enemy was followed up by a heavy skirmish line under com-
 mand of Capt Lawton & a new picket line was established by him on the ground previously occupied by
 the enemy. The manner in which this was conducted by Capt Lawton is deserving especial mention was.
 On the 1st June Lieut R. D. Smith joined. On the 6th the enemy having retreated the Battalion marched to
 "Big Shanty" & set it till the 10th, when continuing the march feeling for the enemy. On the 23rd with
 the Brigade advanced Lieut W. H. Baker Brigade before Kennesaw Mountain remained under fire of the
 enemy's artillery & sharpshooters, within seventy five (75) yards of his works till the 3rd when manfully
 through the smoke in pursuit of the retreating enemy. At "Kennesaw" Lieut Wiley was sent back to help
 not being well. On the 4th of July continued the enemy in position behind woods. Two (2) Companies of the
 Battalion under command of Capt Lawton & Lieut Smith in company with several other companies of the Brigade,
 the whole under command of Capt Lawton & Lieut Smith were advanced as skirmishers, & charging the
 enemy after him, carried them in the most gallant manner. Lieut Smith was slightly wounded but did not per-
 mit his wound to interfere with his duties but for a few days. The rifle pits having been captured by the
 skirmish line, Lieut Smith was ordered forward & the Battalion advanced to its support, under a terrible
 artillery fire which was kept up during the entire day. On the 5th the enemy fell back to the Chattahoochee
 River. The Battalion went into position near "Trumps Station". Here the Battalion of the 16th being consolidated
 took into ours under command of Capt Lawton & assumed command of my company. Having soon
 after received the opportunity of being at the head of the Brigade am unable to report further the operations of my
 Battalion. I cannot close however without mentioning my very affectionate adieu to Lieut W. H. Baker
 for his noble services & for the gallantry & zeal which he always manifested in the performance
 of his duties & to the officers & men of the command I tender my warmest thanks for their un-
 flinching attention to their duties, their conspicuous gallantry, & the patient, uncomplaining devotion,
 with which they toiled & fought, & endured during the summer campaign of the War. For
 the list of casualties I beg leave to refer to the 16th report to which this will be appended.

 will deserve promotion.

I have the honor to submit the following Report of the opera-
 tions of the 16th Battalion, in the Battle of Donelson on April 23rd 1862. The Battalion composed of sixteen compa-
 nies was consolidated for field tactical purposes into eight companies & commanded as follows:
 1st Company Commanded by Capt Robert B. Smith 5th Company Commanded by Lieut Richard D. Smith
 2nd " " Lieut James D. Alexander 6th " " 1st Lieut William Gordon
 3rd " " 1st Lieut William Bell 7th " " Lieut Orin E. Davis
 4th " " Lieut James Russell 8th " " Lieut Thomas B. Burdett
 The whole Battalion commanded by Capt Smith Kellogg, Lieut William Wallace being 16th Adjutant.
 The Battalion left camp at 10 o'clock A.M. (marching with the 7th or Regular Brigade) the first company com-
 manded by Capt R. B. Smith, acting as flanker & skirmisher, the flankers struck the enemy's lines of skir-
 mishers about noon, the Brigade immediately deployed & formed line of battle. The first company acting as skir-
 misher was then withdrawn & placed in line. The Battalion advanced with the Brigade, in line of battle,
 until a point was reached overlooking, directly in front of the silent point of the enemy's entrenched do-
 ble lines, the Brigade was again formed and about 300 Rife the order to assault was given. The second
 company Lieut James D. Alexander commanding, being deployed in front as skirmisher. The Battalion in
 line of battle then advanced for a distance of four hundred yards, through a dense thicket, down
 to, & over, a swamp covered with almost insupportable mucky grasses, making it so terribly dif-
 ficult to preserve the integrity of the line. Emerging into the open field directly in front of the
 enemy's lines, the command was immediately subjected to a destructive fire of musketry. The dis-
 tance before us, over which to advance to reach our enemy, was at least eight hundred yards, &
 the necessity of immediately advancing & taking the works with a dash became apparent to our com-
 mander. Orders were immediately given to that effect & the Battalion at a double quick, led forward
 by Capt Kellogg in a most intrepid manner, assisted gallantly by Lieut Richard D. Smith steadily and
 quietly approached the enemy, & without wavering or hesitating the Battalion assaulted, drove the
 enemy from his works, & immediately entered them; the dash was so impetuous & sudden that a large
 number of the enemy were unable to leave the intrenchments. Almost simultaneously with the capture
 of the works, a deadly fire was opened upon the Battalion from a second line of intrenchment works, con-
 cealed in the woods, directly in our front. For our night flanking the last soon became quiet.
 Capt Kellogg Lieut Burdett & Powell were here wounded. The struggle was continued on and
 around the enemy's intrenchments, the enemy constantly mowing us in front. This fire was

It soon became evident that the second line of the enemy's works could not be successfully assaulted by so thin a line in the face of so great a force. The Dutch therefore fell back, about one hundred yards on good order, turning ^{the fighting} ^{and informed}, still under fire, on their Alons, behind a slight crest ^{between the enemies works} ^{and} a Brigade of the Second Division which was forming in our rear, to make the final assault. Our greatest loss occurred within a short distance of the enemy's works ^{on them}, where for some minutes it was a hand to hand contest. The three officers above named. ^{and} Sergeant Beal, commanding Third Company, were wounded in or near the works.

The command entered the Parade with Eight Officers. Thirty six Non Commissioned Officers ^{and} Twenty five Privates. The total loss. Killed ^{and} wounded, Three Officers. Nine Non Commissioned Officers ^{and} Thirty one Privates ^{and} One Non Commissioned Officer ^{and} Seven Privates. The men of the command behaved with their usual gallantry. ^{and} Sergeants Beal ^{and} Gordon ^{and} Conroy Companies were conspicuous for the soldierly qualities displayed by them on the field. Sergeant Major Andrew Sweeney 2nd Battalion ^{and} Sergeant Major is also mentioned for good conduct. The Color Guard consisting of Sergeants James H. King ^{and} Wm. H. Hickman and Corporals Peter Barnes ^{and} James Reher also attracted my attention. Sergeant H. King still standing by the Alons after being severely wounded. Corp. Barnes was also wounded.

The Officers of the Detachment without exception behaved gallantly ^{and} showed the greatest intrepidity, being ever in the front during the assault, ^{and} at all times during the various positions taken ^{and} formations made necessary by our movements, possessed ^{and} exercised complete control over their companies ^{and} commands.

I call it Post Diamond in memory of Private James Diamond 15th Inf. who died January 14th 1866 of wounds received at the Battle of Snow River, Dec 21-1862. Private Diamond was for some years a Non Com^d Officer in Co. F. 11th Artillery & his Company in this Battle is one of those being noted as the garrison of the new Post.

Sir I have the honor to report that about 5 o'clock on

the morning of July 14-1866. Learning that a party of Indians had broken inside the Packet here & were driving off the stock belonging to our supply train, I with my orderly at once started in pursuit & ordered a number of mounted men to follow me as soon as possible. I followed the track which led directly up & crossed the Piney Fork about four miles above camp. & came in sight of the herd two miles beyond heading down Pine Creek a branch of Tongue River. Post St. Col. Thomas & Sgt. Wheeler a few men & citizen teamsters had by this time joined me & moved with swift horses had gone beyond & were close up to the herd. At a point about twelve miles from camp the Indians turned from the herd upon their advanced men & a running fight ensued which resulted in the killing of Private George Dieckmeyer of Co. F. of the 15th Inf. & the shooting of an Indian by Private William H. Henry of Co. L. Owing to the numerous attacks & the broken character of the country parties present were deemed useless & I signalled the advanced parties to return. Previous to coming to this conclusion I had ordered a large party of Indians about three miles to the right, who suddenly started to force into our rear & cut us off from camp collecting what were

were near I moved towards them. They were deemed to detach a large party to their rear & the remainder formed upon a bluff across which runs the Tongue City road. I at once commenced the attack & some time some distance down the road. Our party being small & being convinced of the presence of a large body of Indians & fearful of morning with an ambulance I withdrew the men & started for my other camp. The Indians at once commenced firing, & reloaded along the hills & streams with the intention of surrounding us & quite a short fire was kept up for some minutes. Arriving at a small strip of trees on a branch of Pine Creek, I halted, dismounted & opened a heavy fire upon them. They advanced so boldly that I ordered a charge which it was supposed they did not again attempt any close to us, although their shots followed us along the ridge. Upon passing over a small elevation from the creek two wagon & heavy loads of cattle were discharged on the road, the wagon were broken into large quantities of robes, animal skins, & other goods scattered around. Lying close to & under the wagon were four dead men & one man mortally wounded. The outfit was recognized as belonging to Private Bassano an old Indian trader commonly known as Frank Pike. They had been killed since summer & the party we had been fighting had undoubtedly committed the deed. Upon reaching the new ground between Pine Creek & Piney Fork we were overtaken by a small party of Indians & one citizen teamster Benjamin Taylor the best show of the soldiers being wounded with arrows. They reported that they had come up from camp after my party had gone up the mountain & in attempting to follow us had struck into the road beyond where the Indian party were killed, were attacked by Indians & one of their party Joseph Donaldson a citizen teamster killed. The family of Bassano consisting of a horse & a pair of fine children were discovered by the natives in the bushes trying to find our camp. I halted my party but the wounded & the Indian party fled into camp. Upon reinforcement an ambulance & tools to bury the dead. Upon the arrival under Brigadier General Pierce & Major I returned to the wagon and found the wounded man Alfred still alive. He received proper medical treatment but died in a few minutes after the arrows were extracted. I buried in one grave the bodies of Private Bassano, William Danais, Alfred & one man unknown & brought into camp for burial the bodies of Henry & Joseph the partner of Bassano & the citizen teamster Joseph Donaldson who was found in the road about three hundred yards beyond the wagon. None of the dead were skinned, but they were horribly mutilated by arrows, balls & knives. I brought into camp twenty two head of cattle & the two wagon heavily loaded with goods of various kind & turned them over to Co. Henry B. Corning 15th Infantry. It being late in the day & the body of the Indian Dieckmeyer who had been reported to me as killed being several miles off the road I did not deem it safe to attempt to recover it. On the 19th inst I with a party went out to the spot & found him still breathing although in a dying condition. He died in a few minutes after I reached him & his body was brought into camp for burial. The Indians got safely off with between twenty & thirty head of mules & horses. I have since learned from the Indian wife & the citizen that the Indian belonged to the Simstake & numbered several hundred.

I am much indebted to Port Lt Col. J. C. Kearney & Dr. H. Hill Mathews for assistance during the fight. The names of my command ^{listed} in a bound & soldierly manner, I enclose a list of casualties. Some Indians are reported killed.

Sir I have the honor to enclose a list of Casualties occurring in a Detachment of the Battalion under my command in an engagement with the Sioux Indians on Pine Creek a branch of Tongue River on the 19th inst. I will state that in addition to the annexed list, Captain James Joseph Donaldson was killed & Benjamin Taylor was severely wounded at the same time.

Previous to the action & early in the morning the Indians had run off a number of good mules & a number of Pierre Bascours an old trader commonly known as Samuel Pelt, Henry Johnson, William Bonair & Moss, the one unknown, all of whom were killed. The massacre took place on the Virginia City Road about six miles west of the place. Some 171 Indians are reported killed.

In compliance with your communication of today, I have the honor to submit to the Colonel Commanding the Regt, the following report of the operations of my party on the 6th inst, while in pursuit of Indians who had attacked the "Wood party". In obedience to the instructions of the Colonel Commanding, I took command of the Cavalry numbering about thirty (30) men under the immediate command of 2^d Lieut M.S. Bingham 2^d U.S.Cav. and proceeded to the Wood train about four miles from the post, which I found corralled and surrounded by Indians. There I was joined by Capt Trout A Brown 15th U.S. Inf and a couple of mounted Infantry who had already started for the relief of the train, and was overtaken by Lieut W.H. Haude 15th U.S. Inf. and started in pursuit of the Indians who retired before us for about four (4) miles, when arriving in a valley through which passed the "Big Horn road" the Indians offered us battle. In the most unaccountable manner the Cavalry turned and commenced a retreat, which I, assisted by Capt Brown and Lieut Haude very earnestly checked, the Indians circling and closing around us it was plain that the retreat if continued, would be a rout and massacre. We therefore with the two mounted Infantrymen who were with us, dismounted from our horses and continuing our operations succeeded in cutting back a few of the Cavalry which resulted in about fourteen men with which we turned and fought the enemy who numbered about one hundred, around us on three sides, while they engaged the mounted Infantry which had started out on the "Big Horn road" under command of Col Harrington came in sight, with the purpose I hoped, of getting to the rear of the enemy who had a low ridge as their back. The Indians seeing the approach of the mounted Infantry, retired, us following, but finding that their rear was not attacked, a large number of them returned, after fighting about twenty minutes longer they again retired, us in pursuit, not being able to overtake them. I concluded to take the road and join Col Harrington's party which we soon found on the road a short distance in advance. I cannot speak too highly of the conduct of Capt Brown and Lieut Haude, without whose assistance I fear we must have suffered very disaster. Lieut Bingham while retreating with the major part of the Cavalry encountered the mounted Infantry as they were descending the road.

and joined them, leaving my party of about fourteen (14) men to oppose a hundred
Indians. I cannot account for this movement on the part of an officer of such
irrefragable gallantry as Lieut. Bingham, but it is presumed that being unable to
check the retreat of his men, he deemed it most prudent to hold his men in
hand as much as possible, and fall back on the mounted Infantry who were
expected down the road. Our casualties at this time was one man wounded two
hours wounded and one killed, three Indian spears were shot, and two men
were now carried from the field.
