1. Upon the recommendation of his commanding officer, the sentence of Private *Patrick Finn*, Company C, 27th U. S. Infantry, promulgated in General Orders No. 2, current series, from these Headquarters, is hereby further mitigated to a forfeiture of ten dollars (\$10) per month of his monthly pay for four months.

Private *Finn* will be released from confinement and restored to duty with his company.
