

July 18/86	Baalen Hermann Sgt Asst. Surgeon	Reports ^{Fort Reno D. D. July 15-1886} that yesterday July 17 accompanied Capt. Stein and commenced in pursuit of some Indians, he found in a small valley 8 miles distant from the post - on the Big Horn Road under and near two almost plundered wagons the dead bodies of the following named persons, viz No 1 Rene Cassano, No 2 Young man about 25 years of age (name unknown), No 3 <u>James</u> - <u>Transter</u> , No 4 Henry Arviseu, No 5 Thomas Burns, and, No 6 Will Downie

18 th Infantry		Reports that on the 12 th August '66 was ordered by Brevet Lt Col Kinney Comdg ^g Post at Big Horn to take Charge of the Escort composed of (30) thirty mounted men which were detailed to guard the U.S. Wagon train (Wilton wagon master) back to Fort Philip Kearney D. T. at the same time to take charge of 9 deserters and turn them over to Capt J. Ten Eyck, Commanding Post Fort Philip Kearney.
		Reports that on the route Indians were seen in large numbers and that they were compelled to travel rapidly and that (4) four horses had to be abandoned and one saddle was lost.
